

Sub: Proposal for merger of **Ch. Brahm Prakash Govt. Engg College** (CBPGECJ), Jaffarpur, Delhi and **Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology, Research** (AIAC&R), Geeta Colony, Delhi with **Netaji Subhas University of Technology, Dwarka, Delhi.**

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**1.0 Background:**

Netaji Subhas University of Technology, Dwarka, Delhi (NSUT): The Delhi Administration (now Govt. of NCT of Delhi), with the approval of Ministry of Human Resources Development (MHRD), Govt. of India, established a new Engineering College by the name of Delhi Institute of Technology (DIT) in July, 1983 to meet the growing demand of manpower in the field of technology. The Institute started with the academic program at UG level in the area of Electronics & Communication Engineering with an intake of 45 Students under the Faculty of Technology, University of Delhi. New programs in the areas of Computer Engineering, Instrumentation & Control Engineering, Manufacturing Processes & Automation Engineering, Information Technology, Biotechnology and

Accordingly, the proposal is conceptualized by merging the two colleges under the DTTE i.e. Ch. Brahm Prakash Govt. Engg College (CBPGECJ), Jaffarpur, Delhi and Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology, Research (AIACTR&R), Geeta Colony, Delhi with NSUT as its West East Campuses respectively. The growth rate of these Institutes is not encouraging despite of their existence for more

Further, learning from the international examples and experiences, it goes without saying that we need to establish institutions in India where science, technology, medicine, humanities and management all strength to each other's existence and contributing to the holistic growth of new interdisciplinary knowledge and researches for benefit of the mankind. For this we need to create synergy among all the five creating scattered campuses of NSUT within Delhi region extending its expertise in five directions with support from them to ensure that best visible for talents all over Delhi for intended deliverables.

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than 12 years. It is expected that once brought under the brand name of NSUT, these institutes will have all round development in the fields of teaching and research.

Such constituent campuses of NSUT are now the need of the day because Delhi and the NCR are expanding. Availability of appropriate infrastructure/ space in the existing colleges can be better utilized under the umbrella of NSUT to cater quality services to the demands of industry and students both. The autonomous nature of NSUT for academic and administrative control shall help in speeding up the decision making process of the *campuses* proposed in this document for producing hassle-free highly skilled and globally competitive scientific and technological workforce which can fuel the industry with relevant new technological ideas and new product incubations. The research outputs will be of high value and for the modern day need of the mankind and for progress of industrially relevant science and technology. Strong linkages shall be forged between teaching and research, university and industry, university and research laboratories and university and medical institutions. With autonomy powers of NSUT, these campuses will be empowered to evolve as exemplary pioneering campuses of NSUT having high productivity of quality scientific and technological human resource centres.

Thus, with above deliverables in mind and for the purpose of "Expanding the Capabilities and Effectiveness of NSUT" proposal is mooted for expanding Quality Education for citizens of Delhi by merging above existing Government Engineering Colleges (Under Delhi Govt) with NSUT as its Campuses.

**2.0 Current Status of Ch. Brahm Prakash Govt. Engg College (CBPGECJ), Jaffarpur, Delhi and Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology, Research"(AIAC&R), Geeta Colony, Delhi:**

Ch. Brahm Prakash Govt. Engineering College Jaffarpur, Delhi (CBPGECJ): Currently running under the administrative control of Dept. of Training & Technical Education, GNCTD and affiliated with GGS Indraprastha University Delhi, commenced B.Tech (Civil Engineering & Information Technology) from academic session 2007-08 and B.Tech (Environmental Engineering) from academic session 2008-09. At present, the College is having an intake of 60 students each in Civil and Information Technology disciplines. Due to low admissions as compared to sanctioned intakes, the Environmental Engineering discipline has been discontinued w.e.f. academic year 2016-17. Moreover, the college

At present, the NSUT is providing education and research in the branches of engineering, technology, sciences, humanities, social sciences and management and for the advancement of learning and dissemination of knowledge in such branches and for certain other matters connected therewith or incidental thereto. Keeping in view of growing global demands in the field of technical education, the University intends to expand its scope in academics and Research & Development across Delhi.

### 3.0 The Proposal:-

The sanctioned posts of teaching faculty at AICT&R are 75 in different cadres. The recruitments for the faculty positions in the College are made through UPSC. One of the biggest challenges faced by AICT&R is the non-appointment of regular faculty despite 18 years of its existence. The institute at present has only 34 regular faculty as against 75 sanctioned strength.

Infrastructure requiring further impetus of growth has availability of state-of-art education, training and research Microwave Engineering with 18 intake in each. As of now the institute Processing, Digital Communication, Information Security and RF & intake in B.Tech (CSE) beside four M.Tech programs namely; Signal since 2008. Currently, the college has 120 intake in B.Tech (ECE), 60 functioning from its new campus located at Geeta Colony, East Delhi session 2001-02 from its old interim campus of Shakarpur. Now it is (Computer Science & Engineering) with intake of 30 from academic B.Tech (Electronics & Communication) with intake of 30 & B.Tech GNCTD and affiliated with GGSIP University, Delhi. It commenced administrative control of Dept. of Training & Technical Education, Research, Geeta Colony, Delhi (AICT&R). Currently running under the Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication Technologies and

staff. The sanctioned posts of teaching faculty at CBPGECJ are, Professors (05), Associate Professors (13) and Assistant Professors (24). The recruitments for the College are made through UPSC. One of the biggest challenges faced by the College (CBPGECJ) is the non-appointment of regular faculty despite 12 years of its existence. Till date, only 4 regular faculty appointments have been made against the sanctioned strength of 42. Same is the case regarding other sanctioned

got approval of 60 seats in Mechanical Engineering w.e.t. 2019-20 is going to have admissions in this branch from 2019-20 onwards.

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For developing its East & West Campuses, the NSUT identified two Delhi government engineering colleges functioning under the administrative control of Training & Technical Education Department, Delhi namely "Ch. Brahm Prakash Govt. Engg. College" (CBPGECJ), Jaffarpur and "Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology & Research"(AICT&R), Geeta Colony Delhi. The proposed West Campus at Jaffarpur shall specialize in the area of core branches like Civil, Architecture & Design, Town Planning, Environmental Engineering etc. and likewise, the East Campus at Geeta Colony will enhance and cater to the needs in the area of Electronics & Communication Engineering and Computer Science.

**4.0 Need and Justification:-**

It has been gathered that CBPGECJ and AICT&R, despite their inception way back in initial years of this millennia, have not progressed much in comparison to other autonomous institutions of the Delhi Govt. This has certainly affected the morale of the students studying in these Colleges. The main reasons for the slow progress/growth of the Colleges can be attributed to the following deficiency/shortcomings.-

- (a) As can be seen in para 2.0, regular faculty strength at both the Institutes is very disappointing. This problem is due to slow recruitment processes and unfortunate court cases against some recruitment. At present, the above two Institutes/Colleges are meeting its requirement of faculty by utilising the existing contractual faculty or by engaging guest faculty. Lack of permanent faculty has taken a toll on quality of technical education. Same is the case regarding other support and administrative staff.
- (b) Lack of Autonomy/slow administrative decision making at CBPGECJ and AICT&R: The College lacks autonomy and has to seek approval from different departments of GNCTD including DTTE, administrative, finance and, I.T. Dept etc. for even routine trivial administrative/financial decisions/matters such as engagement of Guest Faculty, hiring of TPO/DPE, purchases of laboratory facilities, furniture, machinery, and equipment consumes and various other mandatory requirements emanating from AICTE obligations. This manifests itself in slow progress/administrative inconvenience. With the help of autonomy of NSUT, these problems will be addressed to a great extent.
- (c) Operational Efficiency: NSUT has a legacy of last 36 years and has evolved into a well known brand across the world. Making AICT&R and CBPGECJ i.e. EAST and WEST campuses of Netaji Subhas University of Technology would enable the Colleges to function more efficiently as a teaching and research centre in various branches of engineering. It will



- (iii) Resource sharing with different Campuses: The resources of NSUT and its campuses will be shared with each other to maximize the resource utilization and thereby the students can be benefitted.
- (iv) Research & Development activities: GGSIPU, Dwarka is not able to provide the requisite number of research students to these institutions/colleges. Therefore research & Development activities in these Institutions are very less at present. After merger, the research activities in these proposed Campuses will be enhanced by providing more number of Teaching-cum-Research Fellow (research students) to these campuses. The number of M. Tech students will also be increased which will increase the quality education by using the brand name of NSUT.
- (v) Degrees of current enrolled students of these Institutes will continue to be under GGSIP University. The newly enrolled students after merger will be provided with the degree under NSUT.
- (vi) Admission process after merger shall be as per the policy of NSUT.
- (vii) The existing students will pay the same fees as prescribed at the time of admission. The fees for newly enrolled students would be decided by the Board of Management of NSUT.
- (viii) All the recruitments for the sanctioned posts including the vacant posts in these institutes will be done by NSUT as per its rules.

**7.0 Benefits to NCT of Delhi:-**

It is expected that the higher ranked NSUT when expanded by creating some *campuses* in Delhi, as proposed herein, would benefit the Delhi people in general and Delhi students in particular. The capabilities and benefits of academic and research excellence of NSUT can then reach wider population of Delhi region. This expansion of NSUT, which will boost its outreach to citizen of Delhi, will be a significant milestone.

**8.0 Salient Features of the Cabinet Note:**

1. For the purpose of expansion of Netaji Subhas University of Technology and to increase the efficiency and give better study environment and placement to the students, it is proposed that the above two Institutes i.e. (i) Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology, and Research (AIACT&R), Geeta Colony, Delhi and (ii) Ch. Bramha Prakash Govt. Engineering College, Jaffarpur, Delhi; may be merged with NSUT

Since NSUT is also a grant in Aid University of Govt. of Delhi along with these two institutes, the funds for the colleges will also be merged with NSUT funds including students' fund and financial powers will vest in the authorities of NSUT as per NSUT Act, 2017 (Delhi Act, 2018).

**9.0 Financial Model:-**

9. All the recruitments for the sanctioned posts including the vacant posts in these institutes will be done by NSUT as per its rules.

- Financial Implication: It was informed that NSUT is a grant in aid University of GNCTD as also the CBPGECJ and AIACT&R (para 9.0/2/C). Therefore, it is understood that the even after the merger, the funding requirement is proposed to be met through the Grant-in-aid provided by GNCTD. Therefore, the Administrative Department shall be requested to make necessary budget provision under the appropriate budget Head in the "Demand for Grants" accordingly.
- However, it is observed that being termed as a professional University with good track record, efforts shall be made to run the NSUT as a 'Self-financing University' over a period of time with no/very little Government funding.
- The Objective of the proposed merger is to make the low ranked colleges into a Professional University with optimization available resources to impart quality education to the students of Delhi as 85% of the seats are reserved for the Citizens of Delhi.

**Comments of Department of Training and Technical Education**

- The nomenclature of the newly formed Campuses may be decided at the Minister Technical Education.
- For the faculty & staff opting for deputation, as suggested by Finance/Accounts, this deemed deputation will be without deputation allowance.
- Proposal will be submitted for approval of Hon'ble LG for transfer of assets mainly land.
- As commented upon by Finance/Accounts Department, the budget provision made in the Demand for Grants with regard to Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology & Research (AIACT&R), Geeta Colony and (ii) Ch. Brahm Prakash Government Engineering College cannot be merged with the Grant-in-aid provision of NSUT. Since, it is a "New Instrument of Service", the department needs to take necessary steps to seek Supplementary Grants in terms of Rule 66 of GFR, 2017. According to the said advice, necessary budget provisions seeking supplementary grants will be made.
- University will be advised to take necessary steps to become self-financing University over a period of time.

- Comments of Finance (A/Cs) Department, GNCT of Delhi.**
- I. The proposal attracts the provisions of Rule 37-A of CCS (Pension) Rules. Further, as per the information available with FD, Delhi College of Engineering, after its conversion into Delhi Technological University, facing program in settling the service conditions of the employees of erstwhile DCE.
  - II. It is submitted that:
    - As per the provisions laid down in Rule 37-A(1) of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, on conversion of a Department of the Central Government into an Autonomous Body, all Government servants of that Department shall be transferred en masse to that Autonomous Body on terms of foreign service without any deputation allowance till, such time as they get absorbed in the said body and such transferred Government servants shall be absorbed in the Autonomous Body with effect from such date as may be notified by the Government.
    - As per the provisions laid down in Rule 37-A (2) of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, the Government shall allow the transferred Government servants an option to revert back to the Government or to seek permanent absorption in the Autonomous Body.
    - As per the provisions laid down in Rule 37-A (4) of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, the permanent absorption of the Government servants as employees of Autonomous Body shall take effect from the date on which their options are accepted by the Government and from the date of such acceptance, such employees shall cease to be Government servants and they shall be deemed to have retired from Government service.
    - As per the provisions laid down in Rule 37-A (6) of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, the employees who opt to revert to Government service shall be re-deployed through the surplus cell of the Government.
    - As per the provisions laid down in Rule 37-A (12) of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, the Central Government shall create a Pension Fund in the form of a Trust and the Pensionary benefits of absorbed employees shall be paid out of such Pension Fund.
    - As per the provisions laid down in Rule 37-A (14) of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, the procedure and the manner in which Pensionary benefits are to be sanctioned and disbursed from the Pension Fund shall be determined by the Government on the recommendation of the Board of Trustees.

- With the objective of imparting quality education to students of Delhi,

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- As per the provisions laid down in Rule 37-A (15) of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, the Government shall discharge its pensionary liability by paying in lump sum as a one-time payment to the Pension Fund the *pro rata pension or Service Gratuity and Retirement Gratuity for the service rendered till the date of absorption of the Government servant in the Autonomous Body.*
  - As per the provisions laid down in Rule 37-A (17) of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, lump sum amount of the *pro rata pension* shall be determined with reference to the Commutation Table laid down in CCS (Commutation of Pension), 1981.
- III. Hence, FD is on the view that the Department of TTEs should initiate action immediately in accordance with the provisions laid down in Rule 37-A of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, with regard to absorption of the employees of Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology & Research (AICT&R), Geeta Colony and (ii) Ch. Brahm Prakash Government Engineering College, Jaffarpur in NSUT, creation of Pension Fund, constitution of Board of Trustees, etc. so as to avoid litigation cases in future.
- IV. In view of the various provisions of Rule 37-A of CCS (Pension) Rules, FD has no objection to treat the employees of Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology & Research (AICT&R), Geeta Colony and (ii) Ch. Brahm Prakash Government Engineering College, Jaffarpur on deemed foreign service with NSUT without any deputation allowance till a decision on their absorption in the University is taken by the competent Authority.
- V. However, the PAO concerned of Department of TTE (i.e. the Administrative Department of NSUT) may be allocated to enable NSUT to remit the subscriptions of GPF, UTEGIS, NPS, which are deducted from the salary of these employees till a creation on their absorption in the University is taken by the competent authority.
- VI. Further, an officer of Department of TTE has to be designed as Head of Office for the purpose of sanction of GPF advance, service verification and processing of pension cases in respect of the employees of Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology & Research (AICT&R), Geeta Colony and (ii) Ch. Brahm Prakash Government Engineering College, Jaffarpur, till a decision on their absorption in the University is taken by the competent authority. The HOD of Department of TTE will act as HOD with regard to GPF withdrawals, HBA, MCA etc. in respect of these employees till their absorption in the University.
- VII. The Faculty members working on diverted capacity in Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology & Research (AICT&R), Geeta Colony and (ii) Ch. Brahm Prakash Government Engineering College, Jaffarpur, shall be reverted back to their respective parent department before the merger. In case of their requirement in

- further, the same may be taken afresh by NSUT with the respective department.
- VIII. In view of the provisions laid down in Rule-230 (13) of GFR, 2017, ownership of capital assets created out of the funds allocated by Government of NCT of Delhi shall vest in the Government. However, responsibility for upkeep and maintenance of said assets will be the assets out of the funds allocated by Government of Delhi shall be with the approval of Government. In case the title of the land is transferred to NSUT, the approval of the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Delhi shall be obtained by the department before transferring the title.
- IX. As per the approved pattern of assistance, the creation of posts and grant of pay scales shall be with the approval of the Government of NCT of Delhi.
- X. With regard to the proposal of Department of TTE at para 9 of the draft Cabinet Note, NSUT is a grant-in-aid institution whereas Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology & Research (AICT&R), Geeta Colony and (ii) Ch. Brahm Prakash Government Engineering College, Jaffarpur. Hence, the budget provision made in the Demand for Grants with regard to Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology & Research (AICT&R), Geeta Colony and (iii) Ch. Brahm Prakash Government Engineering College, Jaffarpur. Since, it is a "New merged with the Grant-in-aid provision of NSUT. Since, it is a "New Instrument of Service", the department needs to take necessary steps to seek Supplementary Grants in terms of Rule 66 of GFR, 2017.
- XI. FD has no objection to the transfer to students' fund to NSUT.
- XII. FD assumes that NSUT has given their consent for the proposed merger and they have adequate number of Faculty to manage these two colleges also.
- XIII. The department may also seek the opinion of Law Department with regard to the admissibility of the proposed merger under the existing provisions of NSUT Act/Statute.

**Comments of department of Training and Technical Education**

- All the provisions of Rule 37-A of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, as pointed out by the Finance/Account shall be taken into account and accordingly, requisite actions will be taken.
- PAO 13 which is looking after the finances of Department of TTE will be nominated for the purpose of remittance the subscriptions of GPF, UTREGIS, NPS, which are deducted from the salary of these employees till a decision on their absorption in the University is taken by the competent authority.

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**Comments of department of Training and Technical Education**

- Proposal will be submitted for approval of Hon'ble LG for transfer of assets mainly land.
- With regard to the staff on diverted capacity, it is submitted that as advised by the Finance/Accounts such staff will be reverted back to their parent department and in case of their requirement, fresh request will be sent by the NSUT to their parent departments.

**13.0 Comments of the Planning Department and replies of the Department thereon:-**

- I. NSUT has a legacy of rendering quality technical education of 36 years and has evolved into a well-known brand across the country. Merging AIACT&R and Ch. Braham Prakash Govt. Engineering College with NSUT and making them as a East and West campus of NSUT would enable these colleges to function efficiently both academically for quality of teaching, designing of courses, placement etc. and with full autonomy in terms of administrative management.
- II. As the admission in NSUT is done through JEE exams, after merger, intake of students will also improve qualitatively. The academic excellence in terms quality resources of faculty of NSUT can also be shared for the students of these campuses.
- III. New campuses can reap maximum benefit of economy of scale of operations of NSUT in terms of utilisation of other resources like expensive labs, equipment's, industry expertise etc.
- IV. Expansion of campuses of NSUT with the proposed merger may help NSUT to introduce additional market oriented and popular professional and industry oriented courses at UG & PG like Economics, Management etc. like East Campus of DTU may also be offered in these campuses. NSUT, being a State University, can accommodate more Delhi students.
- V. New and emerging discipline in cutting edge areas of professional and technical education can be introduced like artificial intelligence, big data analysis and machine learning, genomic studies, bio technology etc. Industry - academic collaboration can be improved for the benefit of students.
- VI. After merger with NSUT, autonomy will help to faster and timely decision making to achieve academic excellence.
- VII. In view of the above, Planning Department may recommend the proposal of the Department.

1. For the purpose of expansion of Netaji Subhas University of Technology and to increase the efficiency and give better study environment and placement to the students, it is proposed that the above two Institutes i.e. (i) Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology, and Research (AIACT&R), Geeta Colony, Delhi and (ii) Ch. Brama Prakash Govt. Engineering College, Jaffarpur, Delhi; may be merged with NSUT as its East and West Campuses respectively. A detailed justification is in para (5) above.
2. The utilization of these Campuses of NSUT for running the different engineering related programmes will be as per para (6) above.
3. The regular staff members including Principal/faculty/officers/ support staff will be given an option to adopt the service conditions of NSUT or to continue their services on same terms and conditions on which they were appointed. In later case, they may be treated on deemed deputation in NSUT without deputation allowance. All the relevant provisions of Rule 37-A of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, shall be taken into account and accordingly, requisite actions will be taken.
4. The regular faculty members who are on diverted capacity from different Departments/ Institutes of GNCTD will be reverted back to their parent department and in case of their requirement, fresh request will be sent to their parent departments".
5. GNCTD would be required to transfer the following to NSUT:
  - (i) Assets and liabilities including Students' fund
  - (v) Court cases
  - (vi) Sanctioned posts
  - (vii) Land title/ building/ infrastructure etc.(subject to approval of Hon'ble LG).
6. Degrees of current enrolled students of these Institutes will continue to be under GGSIP University. The newly enrolled students after merger will be provided with the degree under NSUT.
7. Admission process after merger shall be as per the policy of NSUT.
8. The existing students will pay the same fees as prescribed at the time of admission. The fees for newly enrolled students would be decided by the Board of Management of NSUT.
9. All the recruitments for the sanctioned posts including the vacant posts in these institutes will be done by NSUT as per its rules.

**14.0 Salient Features of the Cabinet Note after incorporating the suggestions of various departments:**

**Comments of department of Training and Technical Education**

After the proposed merger of two Engineering Colleges in NSUT, the Board of Management of NSUT may take decision on the suggestion of Planning Department.

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15.0 The proposal before the Council of Ministers for its consideration and decision:-

In the light of above, the matter of merger of two existing engineering colleges under DTTE i.e. (i) Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication, Technology, and Research (AICT&R), Geeta Colony, Delhi and (ii) Ch. Bramha Prakash Govt. Engineering College, Jaffarpur, Delhi as East and West Campuses of Netaji Subhas University of Technology, Dwarka, Delhi as per the features elaborated in para 14.0 above, is placed before the Council of Ministers, Govt. of NCT of Delhi for its consideration and decision.

This has the approval of the Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister i.e. the Minister for Training and Technical Education.
