Subject :- 1. Submission of consent to enhance the units of six month trade.


2. Condonation of shortage of attendance.

You must be aware that the admission process for six month trade running in your Institute is going to start in the month of January-2014 and a public notice / advertisement in this concern shall be published in daily newspapers shortly and you shall be informed accordingly.

In case you are interested to increase/ enhance the number of units of trade having six month duration for the session February 2014 to July 2014. Kindly intimate the undersigned with in a week time to the issue of the letter so that the necessary approval from the competent authority may be taken well in time.

The condonation of shortage of attendance percentage to appear in the All India final trade test starting from January/February -2014 shall remain same i.e. 70 % as conveyed earlier vide letter No. F.7 (1)/2009/condonation. Attendance/Trg./-481, dated 04/07/2013.

However there is no relaxation in attendance percentage for the dropout candidates who could not appear in the last All India final trade test due to shortage of attendance percentage and completing their attendance by attending the Institute. They have to complete the attendance percentage up to 80% as prescribed in the training manual to appear in the final trade test.
